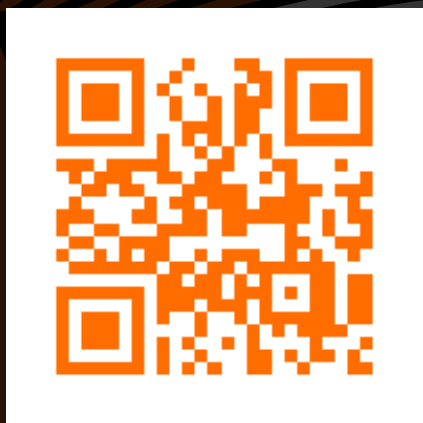
VIRTUAL RESOURCE GUIDE

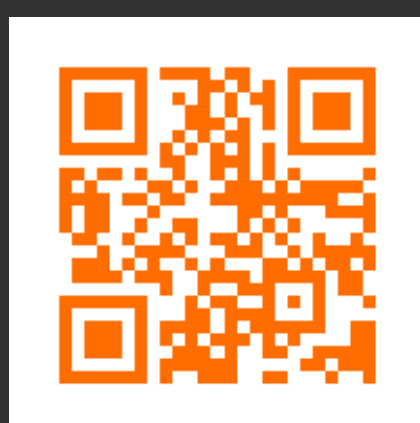

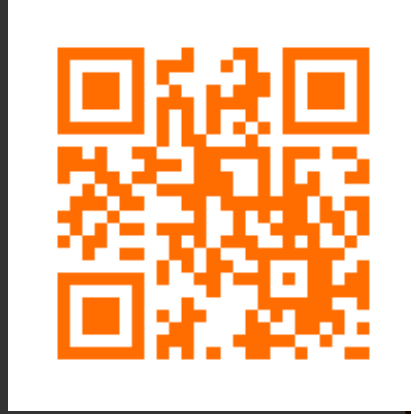

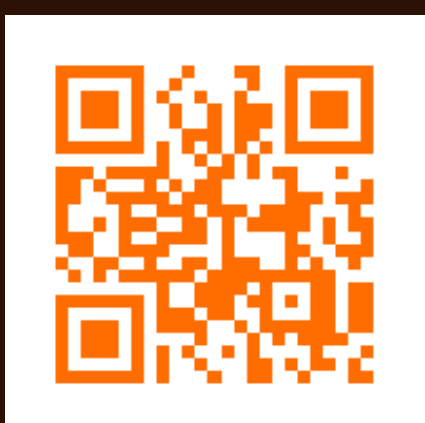
